INTRODUCTION

This is a survey about the results and the impacts of the European Year of Youth (EYY) 2022. Since its launch, the Year was about putting young people centre stage, increasing their participation, listening to what they have to say and acting upon it.

The Year included a series of events and activities for young people. The idea was to boost the efforts of the European Union, EU Member States, regional and local authorities in recognising youth's efforts during the pandemic and supporting and engaging with young people as we emerged from it.

These efforts were guided by the objectives of the Year. These objectives were:

- to make young people aware of the opportunities provided by the green and digital transitions;
- to help young people become more engaged and active citizens;
- to make them aware of the different opportunities available for young people at all levels to support their personal, social and professional development;
- to mainstream a youth perspective into all relevant policymaking at EU level.

The Senate of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (A.U.T.H.) founded the Centre for European Legal Culture (C.E.L.C.) in 2018, with the aim of fostering the participation of citizens in European affairs through their identification with common values, rules and institutions.

One of the ways that the C.E.L.C. has implemented in order to serve the purpose for which it was founded, is the organization in Thessaloniki, every year, of a Human Rights Forum, where representatives of public authorities, NGO representatives and academics from Greece and abroad, gather and consult around a different theme each time.

The 4th Forum was held in Thessaloniki, on 10 and 11 November 2022, on the theme “YOUTH AND EUROPE: A BIDIRECTIONAL RELATIONSHIP.” From the outset, the conference was highlighted as a contribution to the “EUROPEAN YEAR OF YOUTH 2022.”

Students from different faculties of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, under the supervision of professors, prepared proposals that were divided into 6 thematic groups.

Through this Forum, the Centre wanted to give the opportunity to students and graduates of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki to express their opinion on the European Union's contribution so far in improving their living conditions, but to also let them formulate their proposals for the future, for the sake of making the European Union a true political union of equality, solidarity and equal opportunities for all; a secure environment where the young people can make their dreams come true.

The Forum was divided into six sessions with the following themes:

- 1) Education, Training, Retraining, Internship: The E.U. contribution.
- 2) Youth employment and entrepreneurship in the E.U.
- 3) Health and young people in the E.U.
- 4) Culture and youth in the E.U.
- 5) Climate change and the environment: young people's attitudes towards European policies.
- 6) Young people's participation in the decision-making process in the E.U.

The Centre is making sure that young people are heard, as their suggestions will be published in the next issue of the Centre's book series.

The Centre achieved the following three objectives:

- 1) Empowerment of the young people in Europe, as they were encouraged to take charge of their own lives, through facing diverse challenges and through youth work.
- 2) Engagement of the young people in Europe, as they were encouraged towards a meaningful civic, economic, social, cultural and political participation.
- 3) Connection of the young people in Europe, as they were encouraged, through different forms of mobility, to form relations and exchange experiences, a pivotal asset for solidarity and the future development of the European Union.
